

Tram No. 369



Running to the City Depot, February 1974.

This H-Type tram was built in 1929 by Pengelley in South Australia for the Municipal Tramways Trust in Adelaide South Australia, where it operated as Tram No. 369.

Tram No. 369 was purchased by Bendigo Tramways in 2006 for a mere \$1.00, although it cost several thousand dollars to have it transported from Adelaide and a further \$17,000 to restore it to its former glory. Fortunately, the restoration team did find \$32.00 between the tram's windows during the restoration process which helped to offset the costs.

Thanks to the Bendigo Blues and Roots Festival, Tram No. 369 is now better known on the tracks blasting out live music with an enthusiastic crowd singing out the windows as it transforms into the Blues Tram once a month.
